Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Covenant is a word we hear often in Scripture. The Catechism of the Catholic Church gives this definition of covenant: "A solemn agreement between human beings or between God and a human being involving mutual commitments or guarantees. The Bible refers to God's covenants with Noah, Abraham, and Moses as leader of the chosen people, Israel. In the Old Testament or Covenant, God revealed his law through Moses and prepared his people for salvation through the prophets. In the New Testament or Covenant, Christ established a new and eternal covenant through his own sacrificial death and Resurrection. The Christian economy is the new and definitive Covenant which will never pass away, and no new public revelation is to be expected before the glorious manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Jeremiah prophesied about the coming of a new covenant, as we hear in today's first reading. He goes on to say about the Israelites: "for they broke my covenant, and I had to show myself their master, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord. I will place my law within them and write it upon their hearts; I will be their God, and they shall be my people."

Today Jesus says: "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." The gospel concludes today with Jesus' words: "Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." John then states: "He said this indicating the kind of death he would die."

The glory of the Cross, the lifting up of the Son of Man for the salvation of everyone! It was not just for the

Israelites, the Hebrews, the Jewish people but for everyone, as the Greeks came to Jesus, and they represent the gentiles and the rest of the world! The "ruler", the "prince" as another translation puts it, "will be driven out." It will be the end of Satan's dominance in the world! Jesus Christ will reign from the cross and salvation is offered to everyone. This love will draw everyone to Jesus, who will then bring us to the Father. St. Paul says today in the second reading, "he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him." How do we obey Jesus? Very simple. Jesus said, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). Now that is not a difficult command to obey. Let us all go to Jesus and accept his offer of salvation, eternal rest in the God who loves us!





Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A middle-aged woman sat on the couch in my parish office and recounted to me a shocking list of terrible calamities in her life: addictions, terminal illnesses, financial loss, broken relationships, and so on. She smiled as she did so. "Please forgive me," I asked, "but you seem to be smiling as you share this." She said, "Father John, I am totally overwhelmed. But I'm smiling because I just can't wait to see what good things God does with this mess." She expected God would manifest His glory when she most needed it.

This week in the Gospel, God speaks from heaven for the third and final time in Jesus' earthly ministry. It's at a tough moment. Gentiles seek Jesus, who announces his terrible suffering, and then boldly prays, "Father, glorify your name!" John then writes: Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." Was the task of drawing the whole non-Jewish world to himself overwhelming? Or was it the terrible specter of crucifixion? Whatever it was, the crushing weight triggers his turning to the Father with an unshakeable expectation of divine glory to burst through. And indeed, it did on Easter Sunday. In our burdens, our greatest strength is to turn to God and boldly ask Him for His glory.

Lenten challenge: This week, I invite you to list out everything which is a burden to you. Write it down. Then add these words: "Father, glorify Your name in all these things!" Put that paper in your pocket or purse when you come to Holy Week liturgies next week. You might smile at the most unlikely times.

Join your fellow parishioners for adoration and quiet prayer sometime following Holy Thursday Mass through 10 AM Good Friday morning. The Altar of Repose will be located in the school gym (Roncalli Hall). The St. Pius X Knights will be covering every hour of that time so continuous parish coverage is assured. Pick a time that is convenient for you and join them. Let's have a strong St. Pius X showing as we anticipate in quiet prayer and reflection with our Lord His Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection. 
